

What is a Dual Credit Course?

A course where high school students earn both high school and post-secondary credits at the same time for the same course(s).

What Post-Secondary Institutions does the Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture currently have dual credit partnerships with?

University of Prince Edward Island and Holland College

University of Prince Edward Island Dual Credit

PEI high school students who have successfully completed three business related courses (from the PEI provincial curriculum) and met a number of specific criteria, will be eligible to receive a **UPEI elective course (BUS-1010) within their Bachelor of Business Administration Program**.

Specifically, students will receive credit for BUS-1010 if the following requirements are satisfied:

- A. the student graduated high school in 2016-2017 or a subsequent school year
- B. the student has successfully completed **three** of the following courses:
 - 1) BUS701A (required course)
 - 2) ACC621A or ECO621A (one course is required)
 - 3) ACC621A or ECO621A or ENT521A or HOS801A (one course is required with no duplication of courses)
- C. the student has achieved a grade of 70% or higher in each of the above three high school courses
- D. the student is enrolled at the University of Prince Edward Island.

To be awarded the BUS-1010 credit, students must apply for a review after beginning classes at UPEI (this normally takes place after the second week of classes in the Fall semester). This application should be in the form of a written request to the UPEI Registrar's Office. Students will also be exempt from any fees related to this credit.

NOTE: All other academic regulations at UPEI that impact an award of transfer credit must be considered prior to receiving a credit for BUS-1010. The agreement will remain in effect until the agreement is amended or terminated by one or both parties.

Holland College Dual Credits

Accounting Principles - ACC621A

All students who have successfully completed Accounting Principles - ACC621A, and have achieved a grade of 60% or greater, will be exempt from taking the equivalent course at Holland College (ACCT-1001).

ACCT-1001 is either an elective or a core course in the following Holland College programs:

- Golf Club Management
- International Hospitality Management
- Marketing and Advertising Management
- Tourism and Travel Management
- Sport and Leisure Management

This agreement applies to students who completed ACC621A in the 2015-2016 academic year or a subsequent year.

The agreement will remain in effect until the agreement is amended or terminated by one or both parties.

Introductory Economics - ECO621A

All students who have successfully completed Introductory Economics - ECO621A, and have achieved a grade of 60% or greater, will be exempt from taking the equivalent course at Holland College (BUSI-2030).

BUSI-2030 is either an elective or a core course in the following Holland College programs:

- Business Administration
- Accounting Technology
- Marketing and Advertising Management
- Sport and Leisure Management

This agreement applies to students who completed ECO621A in the 2014-2015 academic year or a subsequent year.

The agreement will remain in effect until the agreement is amended or terminated by one or both parties.

Students who are interested in enrolling in the above mentioned programs at Holland College can choose to complete a credit transfer form from Holland College. Students will also be exempt from any fees related to these credits.
